Launched teaching in Seattle, July 2018 Standing Victorious in the Spiritual Battle (SVSB) for students who are now career women




Crossing Lake Washington in July 2019, Anita Chang came to teach in Bellevue, a SVSB group comprising of Christians from different churches


Please pray that through Huei-Yuan and Anita's ministry the Lord can transform lives to build Christ-centered disciples, homes and churches, locally and globally!

Why Many Christians Struggle Living Out Their Freedom in Christ

Why many Christians can't live in freedom as Jesus promises to his disciples in John 8:32? This is the question I ask myself daily in my counseling practice. In the past two years, I've seen Christian clients who are still living in bondages and struggling with different issues, such as depression and anxiety, addiction, unreasonable fear, anger problem, relational conflicts and so on.

No matter what their issue is, it seems their struggles reveal the same pattern, which is at different points of their life, they have believed in and filled themselves with false prophecies about their identity, their life calling, and their relationship with others including God.

For example, many people suffering from depression believe their worth is conditional and dependent on something apart from themselves, like their performance/accomplishment. As a result, they may have a low self-esteem and tend to beat themselves up when things don't go their way. The belief that our worth is conditional is a lie because the Bible clearly tells us God loves us not because what we do or who we are but simply because we put our faith in Jesus Christ, His only son, who died for us while we were still sinners (Romans 5:8) and through whom we were made alive (Ephesians 2:4-9).

However, the real barrier is not these believers don't know the truth well enough. On the contrary, many of them know God's words in their heart and diligently spend time in God's words on a regular basis. The real barrier, from my perspective, is these believers lack the awareness of recognizing the invisible forces underneath their struggles – the false prophecies they abide in over many years of their life. In counseling practice, identifying the false prophecies is what we call finding the root issue. In our Christian living, tackling the false prophecies is waging a war against the evil spiritual forces (Ephesians 6:12).

In other words, we can only change the superficial behaviors associated with one's struggle if we don't identify the root issue – fight the spiritual warfare, expose it to the light of God's truth and invite the Holy Spirit to bring transformation and redemption.

In the case of depression, we can help people work on self-esteem building skills, like positive self-talk, to help them feel better about themselves. But they will still stumble over the same lie again – they are not worthy enough; this lie will manifest in other areas of their life and may even trigger other mental health problems. For instance, they may struggle with fear of intimacy because they believe they are not worthy of love, or they may have anxiety because they are worried about how other people view them. What is more unfortunate is these dynamics will be translated into their relationship with God and cause them to doubt God's unconditional love and acceptance on an unconscious level. Therefore, the ultimate cost of abiding in lies is far more than poor mental health state, it will cost them the opportunity to develop a deeper relationship with God.

To explore the false prophecies that we have been telling ourselves, by the way, we all fall into this trap; we must exercise our muscle of spiritual discernment so that we can recognize Satan's schemes and attacks and develop a plan to fight back. In other words, deepening our knowledge in spiritual warfare provides a roadmap leading to true freedom. When we explore and identify generational sin patterns, family curses, open doors, unconfessed sins and injustice happened to us, we are removing the roadblocks preventing us from getting to the true freedom promised by God.

It's easier said than done, but it's possible. Instead of wondering aimlessly in the wildness of our various struggles, I invite us to turn toward the very trouble we are trying so hard to run away from. We can learn from it, listen to it and challenge ourselves to figure out how Satan has allured us into believing in the lies we now abide in. Only when we have the courage to face the underlying spiritual elements of our struggle can we pray and invite the Holy Spirit to come and redeem our brokenness.
